



Ernest Albert Samuelsen

August 8, 1918 - October 3, 2007

Ernest Albert Samuelsen, 89, of Seabrook Village, Tinton Falls, died peacefully at home on Wednesday October 3. Born in Brooklyn, N.Y., he previously resided in Cherry Hill and Loveladies, N.J. He was a veteran of U.S. Army serving from 1942-1945 as a Supply Sergeant in the 818 Engineer Aviation Battalion. He participated in campaigns of Normandy, Northern France, Ardennes (Battle of the Bulge), the Rhineland and Central Europe. Toward the end of his military service his division built the first American Airfield in Germany and is now known as one of the largest U.S. overseas airfields in the world. Ernest started his professional career with Ford Motor Company, in various capacities from the Accounting Dept to Fleet Sales during his 12 years tenure. Joined ARI, Automotive Resources International of Mt. Laurel, NJ providing him with a very gratifying and successful 23 year career, retiring at age 65 in 1983 as President. He shared the philosophy of ARI's corporate parent organization, Holman Enterprises of Giving Back to the Community. In the capacity of Loaned Executive, he shepherded this fundraising endeavor on behalf of Holman Family of businesses with the United Way of Camden County, Boy Scouts of America and other very worthy charitable organizations for 14 consecutive years until the age of 79. We love you, we miss you and we will keep you in our hearts forever.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 59 wonderful years, Margaret. He was the proud father of Carolyn Heindel and her husband John; Clifford and his wife Ellen and Bonnie Samuelsen. Three years ago, he acquired two lovely granddaughters, Lisa and Laura
