Mary Elizabeth Williams Stewart, 96, of Tinton Falls, passed away peacefully on Saturday, December 19, 2020.

Born on December 24, 1923 in Asbury Park, New Jersey, Mary was the daughter of the late Charles Henry Williams and Lela Jackson Williams. Raised in Asbury Park, New Jersey, she attended Bangs Avenue South School and Asbury Park High School. She received her Bachelor of Science degree in Education in 1945 from Trenton State Teachers College and her Masters of Science degree in Speech Therapy in 1978 from Newark State College.

Mary was an educational professional in the Asbury Park and Newark school systems for 42 years as a classroom teacher and later as a Speech Therapist.
