Judy, RJ and Sherri,

When I learned of Bob's passing yesterday I was deeply saddened. Although I called and spoke to you I wanted to share some thoughts and memories about Bob and some of my personal experiences through the years. As you all Bob was a tremendous man. Bob and I worked together at Ft. Monmouth for over 20 years. Eventually I became Bob's direct Manager along with a team of over 40 employees. And what a team it was! I can tell you Bob had a work ethic I wish all on the team could have emulated. I knew if I ever had a mission that had to be done I could always go to Bob and know without a doubt it would be done. I never had to ask twice or ask how it went. I knew it went well and it went exactly how I asked. He took pride in whatever his task or mission was. We worked many hours of overtime over the years. I never asked Bob if he wanted to work I just added him to the list. You see for over 2 decades I can honestly say Robert Pillis NEVER refused any overtime I offered. It was actually a long running joke in the office. Everyone knew Bob would be working and had more energy than the younger employees. It all started to make sense to me as I matured and had a family of my own. I realized Bob was building a Nest Egg and making sure his family was taken care of. Bob always spoke of his son RJ and his daughter Sheri. I never met them personally but I can tell you he would boast about both of you often and Loved you both tremendously. He also talked of his lovely wife Judy often who worked on the base. I know Judy heard all of the stories of the day to day drama that most offices deal with. Ours just had a bit of flamboyancy! Bob and Judy were guests at my wedding. I know they had blast! Bob would talk about it often. During the early 90's Ft. Monmouth went through its first wave of Base Realignment and Closure. The Army called on my department to spearhead the relocation of equipment and personnel from the CECOM Office Building, Camp Evans and Vint Hill Farms Virginia. This was no small task by any means. Bob was instrumental and as my Senior Class A CDL Driver that personally relocated Hundreds of Tractor Trailer and Flatbed Loads of various Office Equipment, Lab Equipment, Military Vehicles and Systems to the new locations designated on to the Main Post of Ft. Monmouth. Although it may not seem like much what Bob did along with the rest of the team saved the Army millions of dollars. In my 30 plus year career Bob Pillis is the most dependable person I have had the pleasure of working with. Unfortunately Ft. Monmouth had a second wave of BRAC and this time they closed down the base and padlocked the gates for good. This decision displaced and caused many to lose their jobs or retire if they did not move south. I went another direction and lost touch with many who I spent nearly 26 years with every day. In March I called Bob whom I had not seen or spoken to in over 6 years. It was like we never missed a beat. We talked about old corvettes which we both shared interest and our families. Bob told me he had gotten sick but was doing well and feeling better. We had a good 45 minute chat and I told Bob I would visit next time I was in town. Regretfully I know now Bob had fallen ill again. I regret not calling him or seeing him because I didn't know he had become sick again. I will say that we lost a man of integrity and a man that exhibited family values and the best work ethic I am sure I will see in my lifetime. Bob would be the first at work to pick up the lunch tab or throw one of his coworkers a few bucks if they needed it. I know most times never asking for it back. You will be missed Bobby Pillis this I am sure of. I can hear you saying your classic line "What a Mess, What a Mess".

May you Rest in Peace my friend and know you did it Right Bob. God Speed! Until
