Then again, if you felt sorry for yourself for too long, she'd also bluntly tell you to 'suck it up and be tough.' Anyone who came into contact with her, knew her great sense of humor and ability to laugh, even at herself. She was also a caring person, who would, without second thought, give you the shirt of her back if she thought you might need it, even if it left her cold. Slipping a piece of candy in your pocket, or writing you a kind note, or giving you a big smile for no other reason than she loved you, was just her way of doing things.

Mom liked things that were fancy, and from time-to-time, liked to be pampered, and to get her hair and makeup done. But then again, she wouldn't think twice about getting her hands dirty, and was never, ever afraid of work... especially if it meant helping her kids or

grandchildren. She loved to walk, lift weights, and go to Aerobics class, which she still went to several times a week. As much as the exercise, she loved interacting with friends, which for her, were easy to make.

No matter what she did, she would always make her mark, and everyone knew when she was in the room. Mom was a cheerleader in high school, and was always athletic.
