Antonio (Tony) Bongarzone, 93, of Long Branch, NJ peacefully passed away on Thursday, February 12, 2026, at home. He was born in Chiaravalle Centrale, Italy to Antonio and Maria Stagliano Bongarzone and came to this country at the age of 12. He proudly served in the United States army during the Korean war. After the war he returned to Italy and met the love of his life Giuseppina. They returned to the United States and began raising their family. Tony was a self-employed hairdresser, owner of Tonys House of Beauty in West End, Long Branch. During his career he received many awards at hair styling shows and after 56 years he retired in 2014. Tony was also a teacher at the Concorde School of Cosmetology in Ocean Twp. For many years. He was a former member of the Figli Di Colombo Italian Club, Long Branch and coach with the Long Branch Youth Soccer Association. Tony had many passions over the years, horses, hunting, soccer, baseball, his garden and especially his wine making. Tony loved his family deeply and dedicated his life to them.

He is predeceased by his beloved wife, Giuseppina Bongarzone in 2020, his son Carlo, and granddaughter Daniela Bongarzone. Surviving are his loving children, Anthony J. 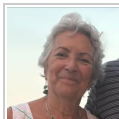

I'm writing from Italy with a heavy heart, wishing I could be there in person to honor my great-uncle, Tony Bongarzone—our beloved Zio Tony.

When I think of Zio Tony, the first words that come to me are gentle, kind, supportive, and noble. He was the kind of man whose presence calmed a room—steady, reassuring, quietly strong. To me, he was more than an uncle. He was a father figure, and I will always carry that in my heart.

One of my most vivid memories is from my first time in the United States when I was only 13. Zio Tony and Zia Pina opened their home to me and welcomed me as if I were their own son. They didn't just offer a place to visit with and play with my cousins—they gave me belonging. They made me feel safe in a new world, and their children made me feel like a brother. That kind of love is rare. It stays with you for life.

After our family emigrated from Italy and settled in Long Branch, Zio Tony and Zia Pina remained a steady source of warmth and support. But even with the distance, the truth never changed—my gratitude never changed, and my love never faded.

Today, I choose to remember Zio Tony as I always saw him: with that gentle, reassuring look—quiet strength, steady goodness, and a heart that made others feel protected and valued. I sincerely hope he is now reunited with Zia Pina in Heaven, together again, and that they are smiling down on all of us—still watching over the family they loved so well.

To my cosuins, and all who loved zio Tony, please accept my deepest condolences. I'm holding you in my prayers from afar, and I'm thankful beyond words for the love Zio Tony (and Zia Pina) gave me when I needed it most.
