



Anupam Dasgupta

November 1, 1946 - June 26, 2022

Anupam (Partha) DasGupta, beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, friend, and colleague residing in Freehold, NJ, passed away on Sunday, June 26. He was 75.

Anupam was born in Shillong, India. His ancestral home was in Sylhet, Bangladesh. He moved to the United States in 1971 as a doctoral student in physics at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge. His professional life took him to the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, the Computer Sciences Corporation in Silver Spring, MD, and culminated at AT&T in Monmouth County, NJ, where he worked for close to 30 years before retiring in 2015 as a respected and much-admired systems analyst.

Anupam had the unique gift of making each person in his life feel special and deeply loved. His group of friends, relatives, and colleagues spanned the globe. He kept in touch with each person and inquired after them, never missing a birthday or special occasion. He was the repository of the goings-on in everyone's life. He touched each person who came into his life in ways unique to each one. In his death, each has lost someone who would always be with them in happiness and in sorrow, be there for them in ways deeply genuine and heartfelt.

In retirement he continued blossoming in so many ways. He was learning 18 languages casually, four earnestly, on Duolingo, the language learning app. He was in the Diamond League, maintaining a continuous streak of 1,298 days. The language of his soul was Sylheti – of which he was a proud and

enthusiastic speaker. He was a sincere student of piano – never missing a day of practice. He read The New York Times with his morning coffee, spending hours until every significant piece of news had been attended to. Everyone who saw him commented that he looked 55 and not 75. He walked five miles a day as he listened to books, totally immersing himself in them. He was in excellent health, his sudden and totally unexpected death coming as an incredible shock to everyone who knew him.

He was married for fifty years to Kasturi (Rumu) DasGupta, professor of sociology at Georgian Court University. He is survived by his wife, son Joyee, daughters Rupa and Ria, son-in-law Michael, and his beloved grandson Sagan. He leaves behind his brother Debasish, his sister Subhra, sister-in-law Ujjaini, brother-in-law Shyamal, nieces Madhumanti and Sriyanti, nephews Jeet and Joy, and niece-in-law Pratyusha. He is predeceased by his mother Dipali, father Anil Bhusan, and adopted son Christian Selway.

A memorial service will be held on Friday, July 1, at Monmouth Memorial Park from 11-1pm. In lieu of flowers, the family asks that donations be made to the causes that meant most to Anupam via the ACLU, Doctors Without Borders, Planned Parenthood, and World Kitchen. It is hard to fathom that we shall not see the smiling friendly face of Anupam in our monthly video chat that we started among our college buddies around the globe since the pandemic which he he joined religiously each and every month. All of us will be missing his dry humor and all the discussions that we had month after month both in the chat and also with him individually. We would like to give our heartfelt sympathy to Kasturi and to Joyee, Rupa and Ria. A void that will be hard to fill.

Going back to our college days, Anupam came from Shillong to join our Pure Physics MSc Class in 1965 in Rajabazar Science College, Calcutta. That's when we all first came to know him. After MSc many of us lost touch with him since he went to Delhi to start his research career, however, we all reconnected as we slowly filtered into USA for higher studies. He got married to Kasturi and came to Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge and started their life in Baton Rouge where Anupam started his PhD in Physics. And many of you probably know their life story from then on.

He was a man of many talents, one of his talents that many of you probably do not know is he was a good cricketer and I remember playing cricket with him in Calcutta in our past vs present students cricket match. By far his biggest quality was his cool composure, his deep knowledge on many subjects and above all his helpfulness to all. He has always been an excellent communicator and great in keeping touch with his old friends and a great family man too. He took great interest in our college buddies group chats and inducted many to the group. Whenever he was In Kolkata he used to meet the friends who were staying in and around Kolkata.

Shyamal remembers the time in mid 70s when we were all students

and my wife Chandra, him and me knocked at their door in Baton Rouge and spent the Christmas with them. They showed us around Baton Rouge, New Orleans and also Lake Ponchartrain. Anupam and Kasturi were wonderful hosts and among other things treated us with various creole egg nogs.

On a personal level we have a great family friendship with them and to me it feels like we have lost one of our own family members. The last I saw him in person was in Calcutta in Feb 2020 just prior to the pandemic when we were both there. We were there for only 4 days. He made sure to come and visit us during that short interval.

It is hard to believe that we would not be able to see his smiling face wearing the big headphone in our next monthly video chat scheduled for July 4th which we are dedicating to Anupam. It is a big loss for all of us. Wherever he is we can hope for an eternal life for him and wish for his soul to Rest in Peace.
