August 27, 1930 - February 18, 2020

Claude M. Campbell, 89, of Tinton Falls, passed away on February 18, 2020. Claude was born in New York but grew up in Jamaica until the age of 16. He was very proud to attend the Infamous Calibar High School there. After losing both his parents by age 15, he was brought back to New York where he worked for a year at Seabrook Farms in NJ. It was there that he met many who would become lifelong friends. He then went back to NYC where he worked downtown as a delivery person in the garment district, before starting his Navy Civilian career at the Brooklyn Navy Shipyard. He also taught Electronics in Manhattan during that time. When the Shipyard closed he transferred to NJ where He worked as a Calibrations Engineer Supervisor at Earle Naval Weapons Station, completing 40 years of Service for the Navy. In his retirement he worked part time for Garfield Courier Services in Neptune. He also contributed in a huge way to his community, volunteering for the Boy Scouts of America for 40 years. He was active in his municipality, working on the Tinton Falls Planning and Zoning boards, where he was once recognized as Planner of the Year for NJ. He also served many years as the Webmaster of Tinton Falls where he could be seen taking pics at all the major town events. He won awards everywhere he worked and volunteered, yet never wanted the acknowledgement for his outstanding achievements.

Claude was predeceased by his son, Claude Rodney Campbell. He is survived by his beloved wife of 58 years, Cynthia Campbell; daughter Linda

Campbell Stevenson (the late Ronald); son Michael Campbell (Melissa); grandchildren Sonia Waters, Tania Adams, Ronald Stevenson IV, Michael Campbell Jr, Christian Campbell, Sarah Campbell, Caroline Ibarra, and Enrique Santos. His Great-grandchildren Joshua Waters Jr, Jonathan Waters, Soleil Waters, and Aiyanna Adams. He also left behind many friends who are considered family. He will be missed more than words can express. 🙏

Our next encounter was when Jason joined the troop, I became the troop committee chairman and later Advancement chairman and merit badge counselor for a few badges. I always sought guidance on directing the boys and the proper way to counsel. He had a unique way of getting the boys interested and learning themselves rather than me teaching. It made my job easier and more interesting in watching the boys grown and wanting to learn. He was my guide to being a good leader.



Next I managed to get him involved in Tinton Falls as a volunteer for the Zoning Board, then the Planning Board, he contributed much to the city in those aspects earning an Municipal Cities award that was given county and statewide. We talked about our city and how to help out in these areas. There were many walks we had discussing our small towns growth. At least every Sunday we walked together and at times with my dog Harley who he like very much. We shared our ideas and thoughts with the city and our boards and our professionals, the city planner and engineer. We enjoyed doing things together and enjoyed talking for hours.

He sailed with me on my boat, visited some yacht clubs with our wives and had lunch while in Florida. Talked about our challenges with our personal computers. Computers and were about the only things I was the expert on and taught him. But strangely, he taught me as well since he always asked why and challenged my thoughts and knowledge.

We kept in touch on about a monthly basis when I moved to Florida. He got my riding lawn mower and snow thrower when I left. He like them and kept Jason as his mechanical contact.

What a friendship, I will remember him always and his wife Cynthia and son Michael. I miss him dearly.
