



## Elsie M. LaParre

April 1, 1933 - January 20, 2026

Elsie Mary (Clausen) La Parre, 92 of Eatontown, died January 20, 2026 at Monmouth Medical Center in Long Branch New Jersey. She was a Procurement Clerk (Steno) for the Army, CECOM, Fort Monmouth, 37 years, retiring April 1993. She and her twin, born April 1, 1933 in Neptune NJ to Aino and Fred Clausen.

She was a Manager and Pitcher of the "Procketts", softball team for the Laboratory Procurement Office; member of a bowling league; life member (15 years) and Treasurer of the Ladies Auxiliary Eatontown Fire Dept; member of the Monmouth Civic Chorus, singing in the Student Prince, Pirates of Penzance and the Hallelujah Chorus; and an Adventuresome Senior Hiker with the Monmouth County Park System, and later with the Holy Trinity Walkers.
