Fred Charles Moessinger, 81, of Wayside, formerly of Holmdel, died Wednesday, October 7, 2009 at Care One at King James, Atlantic Highlands. Born and raised in Brooklyn, N.Y., he was a resident of Holmdel, N.J. for 33 years before moving to Wayside 5 years ago. He graduated with a BA in Sociology from Ohio State University. He was employed by Phillip Morris International, N.Y. as Vice President of Human Resources Internationally for 25 years before his retirement. Fred was also a veteran of the United States Army serving from 1950 to 1952.

He was predeceased by his wife of 45 years Naomi Moessinger in 2003. Surviving is a son; Mark Moessinger, two daughters; Deborah Johnson and Sarah Go, nine grandchildren and one great granddaughter.
