



Leo V. McCabe Jr.

February 21, 1918 - September 29, 2012

Leo V. McCabe Jr., 94, of Tinton Falls, passed away on Saturday September 29, 2012 at home. Born in Jersey City, N.J. he lived most of his life in Glen Rock, N.J. He was a parishioner of St. Catharine's R.C. Church where he was a Eucharistic minister and a member of the finance committee. Leo received the Jubilee Medal Pro Meritis for distinguished service within the Archdiocese of Newark. He graduated from Columbia College with a Bachelor of Science degree and Columbia Business College with a Master's of Science degree. He served in the Navy during World War II as a supply officer attaining the rank of full Lieutenant from 1942 to 1945.

Leo worked in several accounting firms and was Treasurer of the Swepeco Tube Co. in Clifton, N.J. from which he retired in 1985.

He moved to Seabrook Village, Tinton Falls in 1999. He was the treasurer of the first resident council. He helped to establish the Catholic community. He was a member of the health club and past member of the original Village Players and the Silvertones.

Leo was predeceased by his first wife Theresa Fallon McCabe and his sister Mary Doris McCabe Hansult. He is survived by his children; Theresa McCabe of Glen Rock, N.J. and Stephen McCabe of Greenwood Lake, N.Y., His wife; Frances Stouter Fajardo McCabe, four step children; Peggy Fajardo Larkin of Virginia, Ted Fajardo of Matawan, N.J., Bill Fajardo of Ridgewood, N.J. and Larry Fajardo of Illinois. He is also survived by 9 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.
