Mary J. Boeglen, 85, of Tinton Falls, passed away on Wednesday June 2, at Riverview Medical Center, Red Bank. She was born and raised in Erie, Pa. and has been a resident of Tinton Falls since 1967. She was a graduate of Academy High School and the St. Vincent School of Nursing in 1944. She was a veteran of the United States Navy, serving in the Nursing Corps during the Korean Conflict attaining the rank of Lieutenant. Mary worked for the Paterson Army Hospital, at Fort Monmouth, NJ for 28 years retiring in 1985. She was a former member of the Tinton Falls First Aid Squad and a member of the Tinton Falls EMS North and the First Aid Auxillary.
