



## Maxime Nessoir Bazin

April 30, 1926 - May 9, 2025

Maxime Nessoir Bazin, affectionately known as “Nessoir,” passed away peacefully on May 9, 2025, at the age of 99. Born on April 30, 1926, in Pétion-Ville, Haiti, he was the fifth child of Bruneus Bazin and Julia Louis.

Nessoir lived a long, full, and meaningful life marked by hard work, unwavering faith, deep family values, and an unforgettable sense of humor.

He married the love of his life, Eudoxie Celamise Desroches, in 1952, and they built a beautiful life together, raising seven children: Evelyne Bazin, Mireille Jean (Fritzber Jean), Feldert Bazin, Joubert Bazin-predeceased (Paulette Bazin), Clety Bazin (predeceased Curtis Collazo), Dagobert Bazin (Myrlande Bazin), and Ernest Bazin (Judith Bazin). Eudoxie predeceased him in 1987, but his love for her endured for the rest of his life.

A skilled mason in Haiti, Nessoir worked diligently to provide for his family. He strongly believed in the power of education and sacrificed much to ensure his children could attend school. A man of deep Christian faith, he converted to the Baptist tradition and raised his family with the same values and beliefs that guided his own life.

In 1985, Nessoir immigrated to the United States and settled in Asbury Park, New Jersey. There, he worked as a machine operator for Around the Clock, affectionately known as "Kay Jeff." He quickly became a well-known figure in the community of Asbury Park as he was always walking around town visiting friends.

Later in life he spent several peaceful years in Florida, embracing a slower

pace life and enjoying the simple pleasure of planting vegetables, like he did back in Haiti. He especially loved his garden full of pwa kongo and patat. Eventually, he returned to his beloved state of New Jersey to be closer to his family.

Nessoir had an undeniable charm and sharp wit. He was sarcastic, funny, and full of life—even near the end, he was telling jokes and making his loved ones laugh. He adored music, especially Konpa, and loved to dance. He was also known for his fashion sense—always well-dressed, with a hat that completed every outfit.

He was a devoted grandfather and great-grandfather, cherishing time with his 19 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. He also leaves behind many beloved nieces and nephews.

Nessoir was predeceased by his siblings: Monquette Bazin, Eliane Ganthier, Adeladye Bazin, Dominique Bazin, Edouard Bazin, Delcame Bazin, Juslaine Bazin, and Lumene Bazin. He is survived by his brother Andre Bazin.

He will be remembered for his strength, his deep love for family, his faith, his laughter, and the joy he brought to every space he entered. His legacy is one of resilience, humor, and unconditional love—a life well-lived and a man well-loved.
