Vernon W. Manning, 82, of Wall, died Wednesday, March 12, at Care One, Wall. Born in Jersey City, he lived there until moving to Newark in 1951. He then moved to Hazlet in 1956 and lived in Tinton falls for two years and has been a resident of Wall the past two years. Vernon was a Lab Technician for Amerada Hess, Port Redding, NJ, for 30 years before retiring in 1990. Vernon also served as a part time police officer for the Hazlet Police Department for 25 years. He was a veteran of the United States Navy serving from 1941 to 1943. He was a member of the Middletown Elks B.P.O.E. 2179, The Veterans of Foreign Wars, West Keansburg Post and The American Legion of Union Beach. Vernon was the founder of the H.Y.A.L. youth baseball league, Hazlet. He is survived by his wife of 56 years, Elizabeth Manning (nee Love), two daughters and son in laws, Patricia and Kevin Strickland of Tinton Falls, Barbara and Roger Kappe also of Tinton Falls.
